## Year 5 Learning Themes

<u>Literacy</u>: In Term 3 we will begin by learning about poets (for example Michael Rosen) and performance/slam poetry. We will then be learning

about non chronological report writing. This work will be linked to our work about Castles in History and Geography. Any research (using ICT or non fiction texts) the children can do about Castles will benefit their learning in this area. This work will continue into



<u>Mathematics</u>: As you are aware the Year 5 children are in their maths groups. The teachers leading the Maths groups this term are, Miss Bell,

Mr Cliff, Miss Broadbent (Mon-Weds) and Mrs Stanley (Thurs/Fri). The children will be taught objectives from the New Maths Curriculum. The children will be recapping the four number operations, studying data handling and properties of shape. Written arithmetic



maths methods and KIRFs will also be taught. Problem solving will still be explicitly taught every other Friday in sets.

Science: For Terms 3 and 4 we will be studying Light. We will have a

visit from a local Grammar school teacher (Mr Edmeads, Chatham House Grammar School) to inspire our learning and introduce the topic to us on Thursday 21st January. In this session the children will have the opportunity to use light boxes to disperse light using prisms.



Physical, Health, Social and Emotional aspects of learning: In our PSHE lessons, in Term 3 we will be focussing on how we can achieve our goals. In Term 4, Year 5 will consider what is good about themselves and why it is 'Good to be me.'

<u>Art/DT:</u> We will be learning about how a range of Castles within Kent were constructed and then we will create our own castles: initially designing and improving before the production stage.

**French:** This term the children will continue to learn French: they will



learn about giving an opinion about school subjects and the names of items of clothing. We will also continue to Skype our French Pen Pals at the Ecole Montesquieu in Danville.

History/Geography Work: Our historical learning

will be the Attack and Defence of Kent to include focussed learning about Castles and specifically those in Kent. This work will be cross curricular with Geography where we will be studying the position and coastline of Kent including its geographical features.





Religious Education: Elements of Judaism will be the focus of R.E work for the two terms. The children will study the
