Year 4 Learning Themes

English:

In Terms 5 and 6, we will be making cross-curricular links to other subject areas, such as History (Maya) and Science (Electricity and Habitats). We will cover a range of writing genres, including diaries, instructions, reports and description.



In addition, we will continue to drive our Go-Givers PSHE project by writing with empathy, making posters and presenting an assembly to the school.



Knowledge of Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation (VGP) is taught explicitly once a week. Spellings (from the National Curriculum Programmes of Study) are taught and practised daily. In addition to this, children also take their Rainbow Spelling cards home to practise independently.

Mathematics:

In Maths, we will cover a range of new concepts, as well as consolidate the learning from the previous terms. As the children are in sets for Maths, the learning is suited to the needs of the children: therefore coverage in each class can differ. Each week, the children will use their problem solving skills in order to apply their learning to real life situations.



Every day we will reinforce our KIRF targets (Key Instant Recall Facts) through games and whiteboard activities. Every Friday, the children will sit a timed test (suited to their own ability) to attempt to climb the Olympics Times Tables chart!

PSHE: Go-Givers: Make a Difference Challenge

The children have immersed themselves into the project, empathising with children living in challenging situations. This term \P they will coordinate the collection of resources to make toy boxes for children in Europe who have lost everything. They will plan and implement fundraising opportunities and create the packs that will be sent to where they are needed most. Look out for hand-written letters from the children that explain this all in more detail!

Science:

Term 5: Living Things and their Habitats

The children will learn that animals can be grouped in a variety of ways and will use classification keys to group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.

Term 6: Animals including Humans

The children will describe the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system and identify the different types of teeth. in humans and their simple functions. They will construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prev.

Term 5/6: The children will continue to practise playing the recorder.



Religious Education:

Term 5: Christianity: Epiphany, Lent, Ash Wednesday, Easter



Term 6: Islam: Festivals and teachings

History:

Term 5: A non-European society: Mayan civilisation





Geography:

Term 5: Regional study: the Central America rainforest as a habitat and deforestation as a global environmental concern

Term 6: Atlas, map reading and finding features of the land using a key (cross curricular with our History topic — Ancient Egypt)



Term 5: Art/DT: Designing and constructing a working lighthouse and designing and constructing Mayan headdress.

Term 6: Art/DT: The children will be creating their own Egyptian artefacts which we will be sharing with you in our own Egyptian museum!
