ISLE OF WIGHT RESIDENTIAL TRIP – FRIDAY 9TH JUNE 2017 – MONDAY 12TH JUNE 2017

With the Year 6 Residential Trip fast approaching, I am writing to clarify the final arrangements before leaving for the Isle of Wight on Friday.

The children should arrive to School at the slightly earlier time of 8.20am, wearing non uniform, and make their way to the Early Years' Hall with their suitcases and bags. Parents and Carers may stay with them for a few minutes before the register is taken.

Gentle Reminder – please note there should be no mobile phones or laptops taken on the school trip.

Don't forget to pack a substantial double packed lunch, including drinks, for your child which will need to see them through until their evening meal.

The coach will be leaving Joy Lane for Portsmouth at approximately 8.45am and you are very welcome to wave the children off on their exciting adventure! We aim to return to Joy Lane at approximately 8.30pm on Monday but will, of course, contact you if the time is likely to change.

Please remember to include the following for your child in his/her day bag:

A substantial packed lunch including drinks (no fizzy drinks)

Some activities for the coach e.g. book, notepad, tablets, MP3 players etc

Please note the following number should only be used in the event of a family emergency, outside of School hours, when it is imperative that a pupil is contacted. It should not be used as a means to keep in touch with pupils during their stay at Little Canada.

Medication – If your child requires any medication during their stay at Little Canada, this needs to be handed into the School office **on Wednesday 7th June** in a named polythene bag with dosage instructions clearly marked on the box / bottle. **Please do not bring in any medication on the day of travel.**



At the moment the forecast for the weekend of the Residential Trip looks settled. As the activity area is fairly exposed it is advisable to pack plenty of layers, lip balm and sunscreen!

This promises to be an exciting adventure for the children but please be prepared for a delay in hearing all about it as they will be exhausted!!
