Year 1 Newsletter

Terms 3 & 4

Welcome back! We are very proud of how wonderfully the children performed in the Carol Concert, thank you for all your lovely costumes.

This booklet gives a brief overview of some of the things we will be doing in Terms 3 and 4.

We are continuing our learning journey in a variety of exciting subjects. Our learning themes in Terms 3 and 4 are:

Explorers

We will be looking at famous explorers, cultures of other countries and the continents and oceans of the world.



Carnival of the Animals

We will be learning all about different types of animals! We will look at animals with jobs, where food comes from and how animals live in very different places!





Year 1 Learning Themes

Here is an overview of some of the things we will be doing at School:

Phonics:

As you know phonics is a key part of our curriculum in Year 1. We work on sound recognition (knowing what sound letters and groups of letters make), blending skills (reading using sounds) and segmenting skills (sounding out to spell).



English:



We will be continuing our Letters and Sounds Phonics Programme by learning more of our Phase 5 sounds. We are practising writing 'complete sentences' whilst writing in a variety of different genres including fact files, recounts and descriptive writing.

Mathematics:

We will be continuing our number work whilst looking at weight, time and money. We plan a weekly problem solving activity ensuring that children can apply their mathematical skills.

Topics

Explorers: We will be exploring different places around the world and improving our knowledge of the continents and oceans! We will also be looking at some very important explorers such as Christopher Columbus and James Cook.

Carnival of the Animals: We will be researching many different animals, their habitats and comparing the climates they live in. We will also be learning about animals on the farm and where our food comes from!

Supporting your child at home:

Reading:

We encourage the children to continue reading as much as possible at home, it really does make a difference! Children can use a variety of skills such as phonics, pictures, knowledge of key words and comprehension in order to develop their reading.



Spellings:

Spellings are given out each week for children to learn and record in the green spelling books. Spellings are collected in by Thursday to be reviewed and given out on Friday along with the homework. Please feel free to encourage your child to practise writing these words in sentences in their homework books, so they really begin to apply the spellings when writing.

Homework:

We have really enjoyed seeing all the creative and innovative work that the children have done from their homework wheels. Another homework wheel will be sent out for this next term around our topic 'explorers'; a task to be completed each week of your choice from the wheel. The maths part of the wheel will now consist of 2 to 3 tasks for the children to choose from, accessed through the 'My Maths' website. You will receive a login and password for this shortly. Please let us know if you have any teething issues - we are happy to help!
