Teaching is consistently good and there is outstanding practise in all year groups

Teachers use homework well to reinforce and build upon pupils' learning

The behaviour of pupils is good

Pupils take pride in the presentation of their work and in their appearance

Leaders and managers at all levels....are strongly committed to raising pupils' achievement and promoting their well-being

Pupils benefit from a variety of extra-curricular and enrichment activities

Governors are fully away of and support what the Headteacher has done to improve teaching

The School has addressed the improvement points from the previous inspection, acting decisively and effectively
